The Wheat Initiative

- A mechanism to identify synergies and nurture collaborations via facilitated open communications between research and technology development programmes for wheat improvement.
- Findorsed by the Agricultural Ministries from the G20 member states to improve food security and resolve the urgent challenge of sustainably providing enough safe, nutritious and affordable food for a growing population, and supported by research / funding organisations and research groups from many countries


Why wheat?

- > The world's most important food crop
- Provides 20% of all calories and 20% of all protein in developing and developed countries

but


- Wheat production has not met demand in the last 10 yrs
- Demand will increase by 70% by 2050, while yields are stagnating
- Investment in wheat R&D is disproportionally low given the important of the crop


Importance of Wheat as calorie source (2006-08)

Objective: coordinate world-wide wheat improvement research efforts.

Identify synergies and encourage collaborations

 To add value to existing wheat research capabilities and activities through building and strengthening collaborations, coordination of research and support for accessing research outcomes.

Facilitate open communication

 Enable exchange of germplasm, data, materials and ideas within the wheat research community


Support the development of publically available integrated databases and platforms

Develop minimum data standards and protocols for consistent and comparable analyses

Identify and update priorities for wheat research

- Monitor progress of scientific activities
- Communicate to funding agencies the needs of wheat research
